**SMOKELESS
STOVES**



Working with the poorest communities in the hill districts in Nepal we are facilitating improving resilience to climate change as food security, human habitats and water resources are threatened and the population adapts to the changing environment. In these communities there is a huge dependence on and use of firewood resulting in noticeable deforestation. We seek to promote the use of fuel-efficient smokeless stoves. Experience in Nepal has shown these stoves have multiple benefits to health and the environment such as increased fuel efficiency, more time for young woman to attend school (as it is their role to collect firewood), reducing health related impacts and decreased emissions of black carbon.

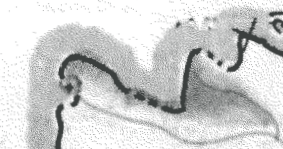




We have supported medical work for nearly six decades to the most poor and marginalised through Green Pastures Hospital in Pokhara. Green Pastures is the biggest leprosy and rehabilitation hospital in Nepal's Western Regions. The hospital provides treatment and rehabilitation for people living with leprosy, spinal cord injuries and other physical disabilities and extends to reconstructive surgery, palliative care and specialist ear care
